



East Orange, NJ

- East Orange, founded in 1863, is located less than 12 miles west of New York City
- In 1903, the East Orange Water Department, which subsequently became the East Orange Water Commission, was founded to service what was then a population of about 20,000
- East Orange is now approx.
 65,000 residents, nearly 90% of whom are African
 American/Caribbean



East Orange Water Reserve



- The East Orange Water Reserve 2,300 acres of land spans three townships (Livingston, Millburn and Florham Park)
- The East Orange Water Works Pumping Station is located on prime real estate in Short Hills, NJ, approximately 13 miles west of East Orange
- Today, the EOWC pumps an average of 11 million gallons of water per day to over 80,000 customers

Water Woes

- Aging infrastructure (over \$20M in repairs)
- Fiscal and technical mismanagement
 - (\$3M deficit)
- Misreporting of contaminant levels
- Damaged reputation due to ethical and criminal misconduct by top administrators
- Loss of customers (Orange and S. Orange Townships)
- Increased water rates
- Public outcry and customer dissatisfaction

- Overhauled Board of Commissioners

May 2, 2016



- 5 of 7 capital projects stalled due to water capacity are now under construction
- Completed \$5.2M construction project to install 3 air strippers to reduce volatile compounds
- City Council approved \$23.4M
 bond to support additional improvements
